#### **WORKMAN'S COMP ID NUMBERS**

Director Greene advised the Board of his research of over 3600 files and out of those, 44 actual shops were questionable. Letters were sent to those shops requesting this information. Director Greene went on to fill the Board in on his conversation with a representative of BWC. The question was posed "What if there was a shop owner that was paying people under the table or claimed to



have only one employee when they really have more and they don't have neither a BWC nor an unemployment number?" The BWC representative told him that, basically, they did not care. The representative went on to say that BWC is more or less a "suggestion." It's like insurance. The only time that there would be a problem is if an injury and a claim is made and there isn't any money to cover the claim. In cases like this, enforcement would take place.

**Board discussion:** BWC & Unemployment being an option. Shops are not required to have these insurances. CRB staff has been trying to get everything caught up and unregistered shops on board. They have received a lot of good responses – Director Greene advised he is trying to get something in writing from BWC.

Per BWC, both sub-contracting & 1099's are fine; they are concerned when there is a claim or a loss. That is when enforcement "kicks-in". At that point, it is turned over to OSHA. BWC doesn't investigate claims or losses, BWC only investigates fraud.

Dave Weber suggested Investigator Gibson start a list of shops he feels should have Workman's Compensation.

B. Status Report on Injunctions (AAG Ted Klecker) - None of the shops under injunction expressed any interest in registering.

Injunctions are pending in Lorain County originally filed

against five body shops.

Zipps Shop Closed – Pre-trail on January 23, 2007 in Lorain County

No one showed up.



Going forward with the injunctions since no one appeared. What we have now on the record with each of these cases are two affidavits: one from Director Greene when he was the investigator, and other from Former Director Cassidy. What has been filed since then is called a Summary Judgment for the injunctions. AAG Klecker is asking the judge to take a look at what's on the record, which is the affidavit stating that these shops are not registered. The three remaining shops being Fender Bender, Rapid Auto Body and Jeff's Auto Body, they are operating as repair shops without registrations. That's all we need to get an injunction.

C. HB 208 Update (Dir. Greene)

Don't think anything is going on with it. Lisa Clark: Hadn't heard anything from Victor. Have been concentrating on that 3901 which had a good response.

#### 6. **NEW BUSINESS:**

A. Status of back fees (Dir. Greene) -

With the Non-Compliance Letters we've generated over \$13,000 in back fees. Check returns have gone from 23% to 11%. Our goal is to get it down to 5% by the end of the next fiscal year. AG Collections Accounts have gone from 233 to 128 and the balance of those accounts has gone from over \$44,000 to just over \$38,000. There have been quite a few shops get legal that hadn't been since 2000-2001. There are an additional 160 more to go out in the near future. Our goal is to get as many legal and up to speed.

B. ASA Meeting, Phoenix, AZ (Dir. Greene) -

MACS convention in Phoenix, Arizona – There was a forum made up of 20 states. The main topic of discussion was getting other states on board. The panel and forum was outstanding. Director Greene presented CRB's PowerPoint presentation.



C. Review of new Goals & Mission Statement (Dir. Greene) – Copies of the revised Goals & Mission Statement were sent out to everyone. Revision was due because the Strickland administration has asked from each board what they are doing to implement the "Turn Around Ohio" initiatives. The initiatives mainly focus on protecting the consumer and what can we do for the people of Ohio. Another thing that they focus on is waste in state government (are we getting our moneys worth out of our people).
